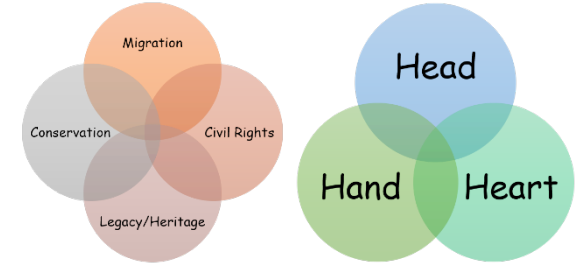

EYFS	<p>Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important. Learn new vocabulary (e.g. in music: ‘percussion’, ‘tambourine’). Listen carefully to rhymes and songs, paying attention to how they sound. Learn rhymes, poems and songs. Develop their small motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently. Count objects, actions and sounds, (through) singing counting songs and number rhymes. Compare and contrast characters from stories, including figures from the past (including) introducing characters, including those from the past using songs. Explore the natural world around them (by) offering opportunities to sing songs and join in with rhymes and poems about the natural world. Listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing their feelings and responses. Sing in a group or on their own, increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody. Explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups.</p>
