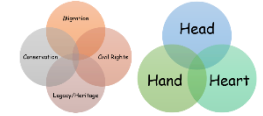







<p>Ancient Egypt was located in North-eastern Africa, along the banks of the River Nile.</p>  <p>The Ancient Egyptian civilization existed at the same time as the British Neolithic era, Bronze Age and Iron Age.</p>  <p>The civilization of Ancient Egypt existed from around 3100 BCE to 30 BCE.</p>	<p>The Nile was a source of freshwater, and the surrounding land was fertile for farming.</p> <p>The Nile was a natural transportation and trade route.</p>  <p>The society had a hierarchical structure.</p> <p>Pharaohs were believed to be divine rulers with a direct connection to the gods.</p> <p>A pharaoh's responsibilities included maintaining Ma'at, protecting Egypt, and ensuring prosperity.</p>	<p>civilization: A large group of people who share certain advanced ways of living and working.</p> <p>agriculture: Nurturing the soil, producing crops, and raising livestock; farming.</p> <p>transportation: The process of moving things from one place to another.</p> <p>hierarchy: The arrangement of people into ranks or classes of importance.</p> <p>society: A system or group of people that depend on each other.</p> <p>pharaoh: A ruler of ancient Egypt.</p> <p>divine: Relating to, or coming directly from, a god.</p> <p>Ma'at: The ancient Egyptian concept of truth, balance and harmony.</p> <p>deity: A god or goddess.</p> <p>afterlife: An existence after death.</p>
