SOURCE STANDARD STAND	The Blitz was a sustained night-time bombing campaign conducted by the German Luftwaffe.  It began on 7th September 1940 and ended on 11th May 1941.	D-Day was a key military operation specifically on 6 <sup>th</sup> June 1944, and considered a turning point in WW2.  World War 2 officially ended on 2 <sup>nd</sup> September 1945, when the last Axis Power (Japan) surrendered.	Allied Forces  Axis Power  Luftwaffe  Blitz  invasion	An alliance of countries that worked together to fight the Nazi's and their supporters.  A group of countries that aimed to invade and take over other nations during WW2, including Nazi Germany.  The German Air Force during WW2.
