<p>Mixing equal amounts of each primary colour makes brown.</p>     <p>Mixing different amounts of each colour can make different types of brown.</p>  <p>Brown is a neutral colour because it can be used to calm or darken other colours.</p> <p>The colour wheel shows us the relationship between the colours.</p> <p>Complementary colours contrast each other. They make each other more vibrant and brighter.</p>		<p>primary colour A colour that cannot be made by mixing other colours.</p> <p>secondary colour A colour made by mixing two primary colours.</p> <p>tertiary colour A colour made by mixing a primary colour with a secondary colour that is next to it.</p> <p>brown A colour made by mixing all three primary colours.</p> <p>complementary colours Colours that are directly opposite each other on the colour wheel.</p> <p>Popular Culture Ideas, music, art, and trends that are well-known and liked by lots of people at a certain time.</p>
