Collagraphy involves gluing and sealing materials to something rigid like cardboard or wood.  Like in relief printing, the material becomes a print	collagraphy relief printing	A print block/plate that is laid over another to create layers of colour. Also, the process of printing over another print.  A type of print making where materials are collaged onto a print block/plate to create interesting designs.  A type of printmaking where the printing surface is cut away so that the design is raised on the surface.
